Alpine Community Center Health Addendum

Alpine Community Center is a place for all people to gather; free of worry from unsafe conditions and illness. It is our hope and duty as members of the Board to ensure everyone who enters is safe, and in return feels safe. In this regard the following will be held as the standard at ACC (and all programs under its auspices):

- —Any person showing any visible signs of illness is not permitted in the center, at all. This includes, but is not limited to: vomiting, diarrhea, infection, pink eye, fever, cough, sore throat, runny nose that is not clear, and weeping sores or wounds.
- -There is an exception for seasonal allergies and asthma. The person leading an event will decide if someone falls under those guidelines. The person affected may be asked to mask, and agrees to do so if asked.

Preschool precautions

- -Children and adults entering the building during preschool operations agree to temperature checks, washing their hands, and adults will mask indoors. Adult volunteers will be up to date on COVID vaccinations.
- -A child brought to school with any symptoms of illness will be masked, and quarantined appropriately until they are picked up.
- —Symptoms of allergies include a CLEAR runny nose, itchy eyes, itchy throat, and stuffy nose. A doctor's note confirming your child's treatment of seasonal allergies must be given to the teacher for them to return to class.
